





## **Program Policies**

## Overall

- 1. Contribute to team discussions and listen to other's points of view.
- 2. Work to promote an inclusive, non-discriminatory environment that respects everyone.
- 3. Bring questions or issues of concern directly to the attention of Dr. Rosenberg, USU Outdoor Recreation Program (ORP), or another appropriate person as soon as possible.

## **River-Trip Specific**

- 4. Participate as a full member of the trip team including to help organize and move gear, set up and take down camp, collect data, cook, clean, etc.
- 5. Use University-owned or provided electronic devices and equipment only for project activities.
- 6. No sex, illegal drugs, or alcohol (University risk and liability).
- 7. Leave at home all personal electronic devices (cell phones, smart phones, iPods, tablets, etc.; can't guarantee service, avoid damage or loss, and promote group cohesion).

## Specific for Research Experience for Undergraduate (Freshman Fall & Spring Semesters)

- 8. Work approximately 5 to 10 hours per week. Keep and submit a timesheet (provided) to record hours worked and so that the University can compensate you at approximately \$8/hour for your time worked.
- 9. Meet regularly with Dr. Rosenberg and graduate students working with Dr. Rosenberg (at mutually agreed-upon dates and frequencies).
- 10. Present results as a poster, oral presentation, or other format at the USU Spring Runoff Conference, Undergraduate Research Forum, or another venue.
